Dear Disciples of Jesus of Bethesda Lutheran,

April is almost here and Easter is on April 9, and the season continues through the rest of April. I love Easter. It ushers in spring and renews the hope and joy that the winter season seems to steal from so many of 115.

It's important for all Christians to understand that Easter is not just a time for decorating eggs, Easter bunnies, and egg hunts, but it is most importantly a celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Remember what the angel told the two women who appeared at Jesus' tomb on that first Easter morning: "Do not be afraid...He has risen from the dead." (Matthew 28:5-6)

The angel's command, "Do not be afraid," is directed to all of us. not just to the two women who approached the tomb. More than anything else the Easter season is a time when the finished work of Christ should be a source of comfort to us all. The truth is we no longer have to fear death and God. That truth was put in perspective for me several years ago.

Following surgery, Carl had been in the nursing home for several months until he could return home. Mildred, his wife, would go every day to visit him. The times that I visited Carl, Mildred was

also there, and the three of us would celebrate Holy Communion together, and have some remarkable conversations about faith in Christ. Both Carl and Mildred were deeply committed Christians, and neither were afraid to die. They knew that God's promise of resurrection to Eternal Life was true.

Every night before Carl would turn in, he would call Mildred, and the two of them would talk for a short time, and pray together. Whether they talked much or not, the one thing they always did, was pray the Lord's prayer together, on the phone.

Carl had been doing very well, and the Doctors assured him that he would be able to go home in about one week. Both he and Mildred were ecstatic about that. The following Saturday night when he called Mildred before going to bed, they only prayed the Lord's Prayer, then said good night.

The following morning, my phone rang at 5:05 AM, just after my alarm went off. Mildred called to tell me that Carl had died that morning around 4:30. Her voice sounded very strained and deeply sad. However, what was remarkable of our short conversation was Mildred's remark, "Isn't it wonderful? Carl died on Easter!"

Mildred was a Christian who allowed her faith to shine right through her grief of losing her husband of 62 years. Later that day, she stated, "I have a very strong faith and so did Carl. I'm not afraid to die, and neither was Carl."

That's what the Easter season is all about. We no longer have to be afraid. As one writer puts it, "The great Easter truth is...not so much that we are to live forever as that we are to live fully now because we are to live forever."

Mildred died two years later, and she faced her death with no fear. They both taught many of us that Easter is more than a season to proclaim that "He is risen." Easter is an opportunity to show others why Christians can cling to the promise that death doesn't have to be feared.

Come worship with us during the Easter Season. If you're like Carl and Mildred and you know where you're going, bring someone with

you who has no idea. Remember, God's Word says, "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes." (Romans 1:16)



Not resuscitation — resurrection!

In the early years of the U.S. space program, a small but powerful rocket was supported by a metal framework. This "escape tower" was bolted to the capsule in which astronauts awaited takeoff. If disaster occurred, the escape tower was to carry the capsule up and away from the main rocket. A parachute would then float the astronauts safely to earth.



Jesus' resurrection is more than a great escape. If he had merely eluded death, that would be akin to resuscitation. By God's power, Jesus didn't merely survive death but conquered it, once and for all. On Easter, Jesus returns to life not for his own sake but for the sake of all humanity. He reassures the disciples — and us — "Peace be with you."

WHAT IS STEWARDSHIP?

What is the first thing that comes to mind when you hear the word "stewardship"? Budgets and spreadsheets? Money? Pledge cards? A grateful response to God? What about love?

For many congregations of the ELCA, stewardship means "the church asking for money" or it means nothing at all. If it draws to mind anything, it is the three-week annual financial response that happens every fall to ensure there is enough money to fund the budget for the next year. While the annual financial response may be wrapped up in religious language, at the end of the day it is about the need of the congregation to receive rather than the need of the giver to give.

Stewardship encompasses so much more than money. It is a way of life. It calls for integration between our faith and the way that we live our lives — we are a church that is energized by lively engagement in our faith and life. Stewardship is a mindset, a culture and a discipline that can never be contained in an annual three-week financial response. According to Clarence Stoughton, former president of Wittenberg University, stewardship is everything we do after we say "I believe." It is the way in which we use all of the resources that God has entrusted to our care so that we can love God and our neighbor. **Stewardship is about love.**

"Stewardship is a matter of the heart. My stewardship practices are a response to the boundless love God first showed me. It means that I am grateful for all that God has generously entrusted to me. As a faithful steward and child of God, I understand that (the) decisions I make, in all aspects of my life, reveal my priorities. It is a privilege to share time, talents and finances, to care for God's earth and to serve my neighbors. Being a good steward has brought me great joy and has helped me grow spiritually. I am blessed to be a blessing."




